Public Service Director's Report

Scott Jamison's report is attached. Jamison reported that the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) has approved the Village for a total of \$387,266 for funding of the Walnut Street Phase 3 project. The total project to reconstruct Walnut Street in permeable pavers from High to Church streets is estimated to cost \$437,266. Of that, \$250,000 would be a grant; \$137,266 would be a zero interest loan; and, \$50,000 will be the local share. Project agreements will not be mailed out until July 1 and the Village cannot start on the project until the OPWC has signed copies of the agreement. Construction will not begin until after Summerfest on August 25, 2012.

Galena Village Hall renovation project is behind schedule due to structural issues that had to be worked around during the rough plumbing stage. The finish work on the project should conclude in early May.

Wastewater Treatment Report

Scott Jamison's report is attached. Jamison reported that the wastewater geobag was operational March 8 and has dewatered 18,000 gallons of biosolids. The project has saved \$3,200 so far. A pump failed on the Walnut Street lift station and is being repaired.

Assistant Service Director Report

Jeanna Burrell's report is attached. Burrell reported that the Ruffner Park teeter totter has been relocated to a safer location. New batting cages have also been completed at the ball field.

She also recommended technology bids to add voice, data, and coaxial cabling to the Galena Village Hall as well as create a sound and recording system in the new Council chambers.

Dave Simmons made a motion to proceed with the recommended phones and sound system. Nancy Feole seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously in a 6-0 voice vote.

Delaware County Regional Planning Commission Report

Mayor Tom Hopper was unable to attend.

BST&G Fire Board Report

Paul Bolander reported emergency sirens are being tested and a discussion was held regarding damage to emergency sirens due to the length of time they are sounded during emergencies. The BST&G Fire District will hold its annual open house June 9th, Noon to 3 p.m.

Parks and Recreation Committee Report

The Committee did not meet.

Special Events Committee Report

Chris Underwood reported that the Easter Egg Hunt was a great success. The weather was beautiful and there was a record turnout. The next event will be the Memorial Day service on the square in Galena on May 28th at 1:00 pm.

Zoning and Planning Commission Report

Mayor Tom Hopper reported that there were meetings and hearings held on revisions to the Zoar Development Plan on the Village Square. The plan originally involved tearing down the house at 46 W. Columbus Street and building four new storefronts. Now, the developer wants to keep the house, sell it with a lot split, and build three storefronts on the remaining property at the corner of Middle and Columbus streets. Lack of on-site parking and rear access are two of the issues to be resolved. The Zoning and Planning Commission hearing on the issue was continued.

Delaware County Local Government Association

Mayor Tom Hopper reported he was unable to attend due to a conflict in other scheduled meetings.

Galena Foundation

Village Solicitor Ken Molnar reported he will need several people to serve on this committee. He is continuing to research and develop.

Summerfest

Minutes of the Greater Galena Civic Association Summerfest Committee Meeting are attached. Scott reported the need for electric power at Ruffner Park for the Kid's Zone. Volunteers are needed for the event to take place on August 25th.

Adjournment

Grace Piper made a motion to adjourn. Rudy Rodriguez seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously in a 6-0 voice vote. The meeting was adjourned at 9:19 p.m.
