## Resolutions

In August Council business, a first reading was held on a resolution to renew the Village's Contract with the City of Delaware's Prosecutor's Office to serve as Galena's municipal prosecutor.

A resolution regarding Joe Walker Road improvements remained tabled at the developer's request.

Council approved a resolution on its first reading to reallocate \$20,000

from the streets fund to the general fund.

## Blackhawk Progress

Public Service Director Dave LaValle informed Council that he is awaiting engineering results from the July test of the wastewater treatment force main to the Estates at Blackhawk development on Dustin Road. Delaware County has in-

spected the force main and lift station to the development. Homewood Corporation informed the Village that it will begin work on 30 lots in the Estates at Blackhawk to complete the development's previously approved phases B and C.

## Sewer News

The Village issued its first quarterly sewer fees billing through Water Quality Management. According to LaValle, the billing is working smoothly with only a few questions from residents. To avoid late payment fees, payments were due September 10, 2005.

mental Protection Agency (OEPA) notified the Village that no comments were received.

One application is to renew Galena's permit to operate the 75,000 gallons per day Donald Miller Wastewater Treatment Plant. The other is to expand the plant to an additional 500,000 gallons per day capacity.

No hearings have been scheduled. Council will begin looking into the pre-engineering phase of this project.
